Managing students' four-year plans is a key part of the Choice Ready framework. Compass can help.

The North Dakota Department of Public Instruction (ND DPI) recently recommended schools across the state use Compass to capture the Four-Year Rolling Plan.

Students already have access to Compass through RUReady.ND.gov to create profiles, better understand their skills, explore careers, learn about employers and colleges, and apply for work-based learning opportunities. It will be a smooth transition for both school professionals and students to also use Compass to manage the Four-Year Rolling Plan. All of these tools and services work together to meet the ND DPI requirements and provide personalized career exploration.



A Year in Review



Happy Holidays from the staff at North Dakota Career and Technical Education. As we close out 2024, I would like to thank everyone involved in Career and Technical Education for a great year. Because of all your hard work and dedication, our students are receiving a first-class educational experience. By partnering with local communities and business partners, students receive access to opportunities that will help them select career paths that best meet their interests and aptitudes.

I want to thank our staff for their hard work in assisting our local CTE programs throughout the year. We have had some great accomplishments and highlights this year including:

- Of the thirteen new and expanding Career and Technology Center Capital Projects, seven have completed construction, with the other six well underway.
- Fifty-seven new and expanding CTE programs approved by the State Board for Career and Technical Education.
- Ninety-one new CTE instructors started in the fall of 2024.
- Twenty-seven new career development counselors and career advisors started in 2024.
- Eight new CTE Directors started in 2024.
- Seventy-four individuals have completed Work-Based Learning Coordinator training and forty-eight endorsed since the summer of 2022. Sixteen coordinators are being supported by the Work-Based Learning Coordinator Grant.
- Usage of the RUReadyND work-based learning module, Compass, continues to grow. Currently 513 employers, 16,000 students and 550 unique work-based learning opportunities are in the module.
- Eight Team Vision Visits, one more scheduled in January and several individual visits.
- 54th Annual North Dakota CTE Conference was held in August, with over 650 participants.
- Two new members to the State Board for Career and Technical Education, appointed by Governor Burgum: Levi Bachmeier (West Fargo) and Jason Rohr (Jamestown).

I am grateful for the opportunity to work with all you. I look forward to what 2025 has to offer.
